MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

I can't believe it! We are now in the 4th quarter, and our wonderful year is ending. What a wonderful school year we have had with so many students being able to take part in the various activities that we provide here at Imagine Madison Ave. School of Arts! From the various student concerts and performances to the electives program. Imagine Madison is always bustling with activity and energy! I would like to give a big thank you to all of the parents and teachers that work to ensure that these activities keep happening and evolving. The last day of school for students is **May 15th**. Research indicates that many students lose the equivalent of one to two months of reading and math skills during the summer and do not score as well on standardized tests as students who continue to learn during the summer. As always, we encourage our scholars to remain active in learning. Please see a few ways to prevent summer learning loss:

- **Make time for learning** – Set aside 15-20 minutes a day for your scholar to read
- **Develop math fact fluency - Roll of the Dice:** Roll two dice and say the math facts that go with those two numbers (practice addition, subtraction, or multiplication) **Knock Down:** Gather a set of blocks, pennies, or other objects that can be stacked. Ask child a math fact; each time they get it correct they get to stack a block or penny. Go until the stack falls over or until they know all of their facts.
- **Improve reading comprehension** – Ask your scholars to read fiction and non-fiction selections and answer the following (why, what, when, who, & where).
- **Encourage journal writing** – Ask your scholar to record their entire summer vacation by writing about their daily events in a notebook.
- **Enroll your Imagine Madison Scholar in our Summer School Program**-Enrollment forms will be coming home soon.

It has truly been a pleasure serving you this year! I am looking forward to another great year when we return from summer break.

School Wide Goals:

Reading: By the end of the 2025 – 2026 school year, the SGP for each quartile of learning in reading will be 50, as measured by annual STAR Renaissance scores.

Math: By the end of the 2025 – 2026 school year, the SGP for each quartile of learning in math will be 50, as measured by annual STAR Renaissance scores.

Economic Sustainability: By the end of the 2025– 2026 school year, the school achieves economic sustainability by operating better than breakeven solely on school-generated funding.

Shared Values: By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, the % of staff with the least understanding of fun will grow from 66% last year to 90% this year with a participation rate of 90%.

Parent Choice: By the end of the 2025 – 2026 school year, the % of students re-enrolling will grow from 80% last year to 85% this year, as measured by Imagine Schools Tableau data.

Character Development: By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, the school is implementing 2 out of the 11 Principles Framework, with a score of 3 or 4 for each Principle, as measured by NACT review of Character.org's Scoring Tool.
